

EXCURSIONS TO KOETHEN AND MEISSEN

K

oethen is situated only 70 km (44 miles) north of Leipzig. Samuel Hahnemann lived and practised in Koethen from 1821 until 1835, and it is here where the Chronic Diseases originated from in 1828. The DZVhÄ was established here in 1829, and in March 2013, the LMHI moved its statutory seat from Geneva to Koethen. Since then, it has not only been declared the "Cradle of Homeopathy" but also the "World Capital of Homeopathy". The promotion of homeopathy is a focal point in the activities of the city. During our excursion you will visit the exhibition "Homeopathy in Koethen", the Hahnemann / Lutze Memorial, the Lutze Clinic and the Hahnemann House, as well as the European Library for Homeopathy.

A city tour to Meissen, where Hahnemann was born on 10 April 1755 will show you places of his childhood and adolescence. Hahnemann's father was a painter and designer in the famous Meissen porcelain manufactory. In acknowledgement of his outstanding merits for the medical science and well-being of all people, Hahnemann became an "Honorary Citizen of the City of Meissen".

We are looking forward to welcoming you at the LMHI Congress 2017 in Leipzig!

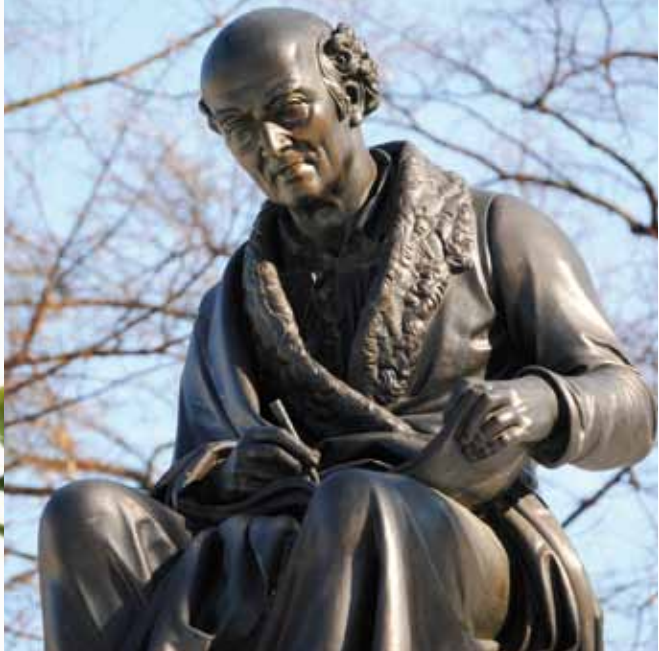

LEIPZIG IS A “HAHNEMANN CITY”



We are very happy that Leipzig will be the host city for this LMHI Congress; it offers best requisites for holding a homeopathic world congress in many ways. Located in the heart of Germany about 150 kilometres (93 miles) south of Berlin, Leipzig is a very lovely, vibrant and open-minded city in the eastern German state of Saxony with a population of around 550,000 inhabitants. Tradition and renewal have always been closely linked here: Leipzig is an old city of commerce and trade fairs established as early as the 12th century. At the same time, it is a city of university, of music and books. And the peaceful revolution of 1989, leading to Germany’s reunification, started with the Monday demonstrations in Leipzig. Today, Leipzig is one of the most prosperous German cities, enjoying an extraordinarily diverse and exciting city-flair.



Samuel Hahnemann was born in Meissen, near Dresden, on 10 April 1755. He later travelled around Saxony for several years and stayed in many different towns and villages for varying lengths of time and settled at different times in Dresden, Torgau, Leipzig and Koethen (Anhalt). In 1775, Hahnemann moved to Leipzig to study medicine but left for Vienna four years later due to Leipzig’s lack of clinical facilities. He returned in 1811 with the intention of teaching his new medical system at the University of Leipzig. The Hahnemann Monument in Leipzig, unveiled in 1851, has been restored and can still be visited today.

The congress venue for the LMHI Congress 2017 is the beautiful and newly-restructured “Kongresshalle Leipzig” situated in the city centre right next to the famous Leipzig Zoo.
